PROJECT UPDATE AND SCHEDULE

This is a general schedule and is subject to change due to weather delays or unforeseen issues during construction.

Trees planned for removal with the project have been cut down. Site grading is complete, and the paved trail section has been cut into the ground. The aggregate base for the trail has also been installed. The bases for the picnic table and grill were installed last week and the concrete slab for both was poured.

The bituminous trail will be paved next week. The picnic table and grill will be installed shortly thereafter. The hammock poles are on back order and should arrive in the coming weeks. Trees and other landscaping elements will be installed upon completion of the first lift of the bituminous trail. The grass trail will be completed with the installation of trees and landscaping.

The project is required to be complete by the end of October 2021.
