PROJECT UPDATE AND SCHEDULE

Cleaning and inspection of the sanitary sewer lines were completed the week of June 6, 2022.

The next stage in the project consists of rehabilitating the city sanitary sewer main line by constructing a new cured-in-place liner inside the existing sanitary sewer main. Robotic equipment will access the sewer main from manholes and perform the work under the street, without digging.

The contractor anticipates lining of the sanitary sewer lines starting the week of July 11, 2022. We anticipate there to be no interruptions to your sewer service during the lining activity. The project is required to be completed by September 16, 2022, for all areas. There is no direct cost to you for this improvement.

AREA A

Work is between Spencer Street and Main Street between 4th, 5th, and 6th Avenue.

AREA B

Work is on Spencer Street between 10th and 11th Avenue.

AREA C

Work is on Marschall Road between Gorman Street and Shakopee Avenue.

AREA D

Work is on 12th Avenue between Quincy Street and Adam Street.
