

Tilia 'cordata' Corinthian

Description:

The Corinthian Linden produces a prolific flowering display in the summer. Showy clusters of tiny white or pale yellow flowers emerge in June or July. Displayed above the blooms are a leaf-like bract. The following fruits are tiny, rounded nutlets.

This tree prefers to be planted in partial shade sites to prevent leaf scorching from the sun. The Corinthian Linden can be planted in smaller landscapes where narrow trees will more easily fit, providing a charming vertical accent or screen between properties. It is tolerant of locations with dry soils and compacted soil. Attractive to butterflies and hummingbirds.
